HABITAT INTERFAITH COMMUNITY BUILD

FPC is working with Judea Reform, Fisher Memorial and Watts Street Baptist in rehabbing a house with Habitat for Humanity to honor the service of *Rabbi John Freedman*, *Bishop Elroy Lewis*, *Reverend Mel Watts*, and our pastor, *Joe Harvard*. These four men have worked together for over 25 years, advocating for social justice, improving race relations, and fostering meaningful partnerships across faiths to further God's kingdom here in Durham.

Our four congregations are working together over the next five months to rehab a house at 1103 Taylor Street in the east Durham neighborhood around the Golden Belt complex. We welcome FPC members' contributions of both time and money for the project. Work days at the site will include Thursday afternoons from 12:30-3:30, a morning and afternoon shift on Saturday, and an afternoon shift on Sunday. FPC is taking the lead in recruiting volunteers for Thursday afternoons, though volunteers are welcome for any of the four shifts.

Our work on the house begins next week on Thursday, February 23, and we'd love to have a good turnout to kick things off. The Blessing of the Build will be on Sunday afternoon, the 26, at 3:00. We hope to have a good turnout from all four congregations for the blessing, which is always a very meaningful experience.

Signup sheets will be available on Sunday before and after church, or let *Tom Bacon* or *Sharon Hirsch* know if you can be there for the afternoon of the 23rd.
