

Making Holy Week Holy

Next week is Palm/Passion Sunday. It is a wonderful week of celebrating God's grace. It is a week so filled with saving events that we call it "Holy Week." But those seven days will be holy—and help to make us holy—only if we participate in the events that fill them. Sunday we bless and distribute the palms that recall our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, after which we hear proclaimed the story of his passion and death in Luke's Gospel. On Thursday evening we will share the bread and the cup of the Lord's Supper; Good Friday there will be a noonday Stations of the Cross in our church neighborhood.

If you and your family have never had the experience of immersing yourselves in the full expression of liturgical celebrations that make this week "holy," then I urge you to consider doing so this year. What a wonderful and formative experience of faith for young children to be part of a family for whom the worship of Holy Week celebrations come alive in the energy and prayerful enthusiasm of the assembly of faith!

One of our core values is "the exploration of our response to the call to discipleship and to consider questions of faith at all points on our journey with the Risen Christ." This is a top priority of our congregation--the development of a deeper spiritual life for every member. I cannot imagine a better investment than to join fully in the spirit and celebrations of Holy Week. Plan on making *your* Holy Week "holy" by joining in the week's saving events.

DURHAM CAN ASSEMBLY

First Presbyterian hosted a diverse group of over 500 people at a Durham CAN Delegates Assembly this past Sunday. In the presence of city and county officials and candidates for elected office, the Assembly addressed affordable housing, school counselors in Durham Public Schools, and the need for alternative ID's for some people in the Latino community. CAN never endorses candidates, but we did have a chance to ask them specific questions about which of our efforts they will support. Our own congregation had about 25 people present. Homer Ashby opened the meeting with prayer and **Susan Dunlap** spoke about affordable housina.
