Dear Friends,

Well, it seems the world did not come to an end on May 21, as some had proposed. Some of us were very pleased to have awakened on May 22 intact, without having to worry about our pets. As one member reflected, "If heaven is a place where my dogs are not welcome, then I'm not sure I want to go there." But if you happen to listen to Christian radio or watch the Christian broadcasting channels, you will notice that some people are sincerely upset that the anticipated rapture did not come to pass.

By the way, in looking up a word on Merriam Webster on-line, I noticed that the #2 word most frequently requested last week was "rapture". So people are truly intrigued, even if they feign indifference. As in the Old Testament story where Zerubbabel rebuilds the Temple after the exile, "Many . . . wept aloud . . . while many others shouted for joy. No one could distinguish the sound of the shouts of joy from the sound of weeping, because the people made so much noise." (Ezra 3: 12-13)

I imagine the same is true in the Presbyterian Church, with the passage of Amendment 10-A, the revised wording for ordination standards. Some people are rejoicing at this change, and some are weeping; and all of us belong to one-another as members of Christ's body. So, how will we live into the future as God's unraptured noisy weeping/rejoicing family? I hope you will help frame the answer to this question as we seek to discern God's way for our future together. I look forward to seeing you Sunday!
