Summer Reading Series "The Legacy of Pauli Murray"

The Summer Reading Series continues on Sunday with a discussion on The Dream is Freedom: Pauli Murray and American Democratic Faith by Sarah Azaransky. This discussion will be led by Barbara Lau. Pauli Murray (1910-1995) was a poet, lawyer, activist, and the first female African-American Episcopal priest. Examining Murray's body of published and unpublished writing, Azaransky traces the development of Murray's thought over 50 years. Barbara Lau, director of the Pauli Murray Project, is an award-winning exhibition curator and children's book author and has more than 20 years of professional experience as a folklorist, oral historian, teacher, curator, radio producer, and consultant and has served as the Community Documentary Projects director at the Center for Documentary Studies at Duke University.
