

SAFETY AT FPC

We are a downtown church committed to providing hospitality to the stranger. While we are not experiencing safety issues at this time, our location and mission come with certain safety concerns. Here are two safety tips:

- When you exit the church facilities in the evening after a meeting or choir practice, please go into the parking lot along with others and not alone.
- Even though your heart may tell you to give money to those who approach you in the parking lot for assistance, please refrain. It would be helpful to suggest to the person that they may wish to come by the church and/or stop by Urban Ministries in the morning for help. The church provides help to those needing it on a daily basis and also partners with Urban Ministries to enhance our efforts to serve our neighbors.

PARKING LOT CHANGES

We will soon change to a one-way traffic pattern in and out of the church's parking lot. The <u>only entrance</u> to our lot will be from Liberty Street. The <u>only exit</u> will be onto Roxboro Street. Drivers coming north on Roxboro are asked to pass the lot, turn right onto Liberty, and use that entrance. The lot will be sealed and re-striped, a crosswalk and arrows will be painted on the lot to help with traffic flow, and handicapped spaces will be obvious and well-marked.
