World Premieres! The Chamber Choir of the Choral Society of Durham and members of the Vocal Arts Ensemble of Durham Sunday, October 21

A free concert with the Ciompi Quartet and pianist Randall Love Rodney Wynkoop and the Choral Society Chamber Choir are proud to present the world premieres of two works by local composers. Bill Robinson's Mantra Cantata is a setting of three Sanskrit devotional texts for chorus, string orchestra, and piano. Paul Leary's Cries of Revelation, for soprano and tenor soloists, chorus, string orchestra, horn, piano, and six-channel electronics, uses texts from the Book of Revelation and 19th-century Scottish mystic Margaret McDonald. Also on the program is Leary's Against My Love, a setting of Shakespeare's Sonnet 63 for chorus and string quartet. Robinson is on the NCSU physics faculty, and Leary holds a Ph.D. in composition from Duke.
