Dear friends,

Today is All Saints' Day. This is the day when we remember the saints in our lives and in our community who have gone before us. We remember the way they lived their lives in faith and love, even as we acknowledge their imperfections.

As members of the Body of Christ, the Church universal, we seek to live lives that reflect our faith and trust in God. We seek to follow Jesus to the best of our ability in the way we live, work, play, and act. Often, however, we feel that though we have tried, we have missed the mark. This is where grace comes in. God's grace invites us anew into a loving and faithful relationship with God, through Christ. We have a new opportunity to live the way we are called to live – in loving relationship with God and with God's children of the world.

This Sunday, we will read from Ephesians 1:11-23. As a part of your devotional time this week, I invite you to read this passage considering our celebration on Sunday of the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion as well as All Saints' Day. You may wish to explore these questions: "What saints do you remember in your prayers and give thanks for on a regular basis (1:15-16)? How have these saints changed your life? What have you learned from them about faith in God and love of others? What would you like to emulate in your own life? What does it mean to have a "spirit of wisdom" (1:17)? What does that look like in the life of a saint you know? What does that look like in your own life? How might you grow in wisdom and faith as a follower of Christ?

Join us for worship on Sunday as we celebrate God's promises in the waters of baptism and as we remember the saints in our community who have gone to live in God's heavenly Kingdom of peace, love, and joy.

Congratulations to Efland PC and Cherrie Henry!

Efland Presbyterian Church has received a grant of \$49,202.00 to enable its minister, **Rev. Cheryl B. Henry** to participate in the 2016 National Clergy Renewal Program. Efland Presbyterian Church is one of 146 congregations across the United States selected to participate in this competitive grant program, which is funded by Lilly Endowment Inc. and administered by Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis. Established by the Endowment in 2000, the program's grants allow Christian congregations to support their pastors with the gift of extended time away from their ministerial duties and responsibilities. **Rev. Henry also serves as a Parish Associate for Young Adults at First Presbyterian Church in Durham, NC.**

For her sabbatical, Rev. Henry, who has been a regular walker and hiker for the last 20 years, will hike, along with her family, 15 days on the oldest pilgrim trail in Europe, the "El Camino." In addition, they will make a pilgrimage around the United Kingdom exploring Wales, Iona and Scotland among other places. Once home, Rev. Henry will settle into a time of sabbatical rest and prayer. Co-current with Rev. Henry's sabbatical the grant allows for the Efland Presbyterian Church Congregation under the leadership of Pastoral Intern Mark McHugh to take a pilgrimage of its own to the NC Mountains to visit the Ashe County Fresco Churches of St. Mary's and Holy Trinity.

FPC SESSION BRIEFS

Session Meeting, Oct 24, 2016

The officers of the church enjoyed a lively and informative meeting on October 24. During the meeting, they:

- Listened to and considered various efforts to compassionately assist the homeless population which uses the FPC grounds;
- Approved the establishment of a permanent Investment Subcommittee of the Finance and Investment Committee;
- Approved adoption of a Consolidated Statement of Investment Policy;
- Approved the request that youth and youth advisors who are not already ordained be allowed to serve communion on Youth Sunday. Ordained elders will prepare the elements;
- Enjoyed examining new members over dinner, and formally received them into membership during the meeting. Eight new members will be joining our congregation October 30, 2016!

At FPC, a quorum of the session is 25% of the elders, including the moderator, and a quorum of the congregation is 10% of active members. A quorum at a presbytery meeting is comprised of three ruling elders, three teaching elders, and three different churches represented.
