

A Minute for Stewardship

When I was 10 years old, my father decided it was time for me to start my "artistic" career. He got me a part in a poetry night at the theatre where he used to work.

After many days of rehearsals, the night of my debut finally came. I was terrified. The huge stage, in my young eyes at least, and the even bigger house were frightening. The little me, petrified in the middle of the stage, under hundreds of eyes! I looked over my shoulder. My father, behind the curtain, on the right wing, was signaling me: "Go on!" The light in his blue eyes and his smile gave me courage. I remembered all the lines and went on with confidence, knowing he was there, behind me, my strength and my support. Nothing bad could ever happen as long as he was there.

This is the feeling I get when I think about this church. It is here, behind me, assuring me I can go on. It will always be there to support me, to be my strength and my courage if I need it. Church means different things to each of us. For me it is the confidence I am not alone. I have a family here that supports me and encourages me when I am most in distress.

This was a very difficult year for Talitha and me as we lost Edward to cancer. But you were there, behind us, helping, supporting and encouraging us. Your unconditional love and support helped us to go on. You gave me the gift of time. This is what we do in a church: we give! We give time, we give talent, we give money

My father always told me: "Whatever you give, God will always send you even more!" I am sure there is a verse in the Bible about this, but I do not know it.

When I look through the blue chips of our church's wonderful stained windows, I can see my father smiling at me: "I am here! I support you! Go on!"... But maybe it is God, who is smiling at all of us... so we can go on.

FROM THE PARISH ASSOCIATE


Last Sunday *Marilyn* excitedly told me to check in my mailbox before leaving church. "I found something! I think it will preach," was all she said. In my box I found the November 11, 2015 *Christian* Century article about Dr. Jeffrey A. Miller, asst. professor of English at Montclair State Univ., who recently uncovered the earliest draft translation of the Bible known to us as the King James Version published in 1611. He found it in a notebook belonging to Samuel Ward, a 17th century biblical scholar whose work sat on the shelves at Cambridge University untouched all these years. . . . in a certain sense this draft was hiding in plain sight," Miller said. "The draft was there for hundreds of years, but no one realized exactly what it was." (The Christian Century, November 11, 2015. p. 14.)

Miller's discovery is much like the discovery Josiah made in II Kings 22 when he found the book of the law. Their stories make us wonder what treasures are hiding in plain sight still. What gifts from God do we pass every day without realizing what they are? And most importantly, what are the consequences for leaving them unnoticed? Well, that will preach! See you on Sunday!
