Associate Pastor

The Generosity of Jesus Our life of discipleship and our life together in this congregation offer many possibilities to give and receive support. I marvel at the ways I have seen people support each other in hard times of illness, disability, death and the grieving process that follows. I am delighted at the support our youth receive from this community in so many ways. I am edified to see the outreach of support extended beyond the friendly confines of our church in manifold ways of service and mission. And our financial support is also critical. We need to be deliberate and generous in our giving.

The second reading this Sunday is a classic text on generosity. Our yearly pledges are the bedrock of ongoing support for our outward mission in the world and the inner life of communion and fellowship that we are as Church. We received a very generous challenge from an anonymous member of our church a few weeks ago that gives us a summer opportunity to remember how rich we are as gifted people in Jesus Christ. We are tremendously rich. "We know the generous act of Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Paul speaks in 2 Corinthians 8:13 of a fair balance. He is not asking us to impoverish ourselves to the point of hardship, but the measure of those in need (the reason for the challenge grant!) has to be balanced with our "present abundance" (2 Corinthians 8:14).

We all make our giving decisions differently, but the key element is that our giving of time, talent and treasure be an intentional and deliberate decision. Paul appeals to the generosity of Christ as the ground for the generosity he expects of us, and I join him in asking you to do the same.

EXCERPTS FROM FPC'S

LETTER TO EMANUEL AME

Dear Friends in Christ,

The members of First Presbyterian Church in Durham, North Carolina, join hands with you in bearing the burden of your profound loss as we share in your deep grief. We resonate with the truth that "the heart and soul of South Carolina has been broken." We pray with you, "Mother Emanuel," and for you. [...]

In response to this act of evil, we renew our promise to be an agent of reconciliation and healing in our own city; we promise to promote dialogue and action to improve relationships across differences in our community. This is what the Gospel demands. We renew our commitment to translate words to action, to preach hope for "new sight" to those blinded by racism and bigotry, and to practice what we preach and thus welcome and celebrate the diversity of the Body of Christ.

With heavy hearts, we extend to you our prayer, our compassion, and our pledge to you that we will work in our community and in this nation to create effective ongoing action to make our family of faith an effective sign of Christ's love, justice and openness. [...]
