
#### How to Find Us

His recent books include: Theology for Liberal Protestants: God the *Creator*; *Theology for Liberal Presbyterians and Other* Endangered Species; Reforming Protestantism: Christian Commitment in Today's World; and Hopeful Realism: Recovering the Poetry of Theology. Classes he teaches at Davidson include Being Human, Basic Christian Beliefs, Prophetic Christianity in America During the 20th Century, Reformed Theology and Ethics, Major Figures in Theology and Ethics: Jonathan Edwards and H. Richard Niebuhr, and Seminar in John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion.
