When Beth Stringfield rose to present the PNC report and said, "We have extended a call to a candidate, and they have accepted to be our next Pastor and Head of Staff," sighs of relief and cheers of acclamation went up from the Session. Thanks be to God! We have a new Pastor in sight! Beth, her face flushed with excitement, could not have been more gracious in thanking the Session and the whole church for praying for the PNC and allowing the PNC time to work their process in order to find "the right candidate" to step into leadership at FPC. She says the PNC was enthusiastic and unanimous with their decision. So, many thanks to Paul Baldasare, chair, and the rest of the PNC for the gift of your time, commitment and discernment.

What's next? The Session has called for a Congregational Meeting on February 14 for the purpose of approving the call, and the terms of call for the new Pastor. It is then that we will find out who our new Pastor will be. The congregation must vote to approve the recommendation that will come from the Presbytery and the PNC. All voting members will be asked to participate. In the meantime, please remain prayerful for smooth transitions. It is never easy when Pastors leave one call to accept another. Pray for hospitality and welcome as we look ahead to receiving a new Pastor. And please express gratitude to our wonderful, dedicated PNC members. You will receive a letter from them this week.

Session Briefs from February 1, 2016

- Accepted a report from **Beth Stringfield** on behalf of the **Pastor Nominating** Committee, that they had enthusiastically and unanimously extended a call to someone as Pastor/Head of Staff, and that call had been accepted. The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, February 14 to vote on the call and the terms of call for the new Pastor/Head of Staff, and also to vote on the four atlarge members for the Nominating Committee for officers.
- •Approved \$250 from the Allen Verhey Memorial Fund to support the Second Annual Allen Verhey Memorial Student Colloquium at Duke University in March.
- Approved the FPC Investment Purpose and Scope Preamble
- Approved a request to liquidate all FPC holdings at the earliest opportunity with Sapere and deposit them into Fidelity custodial accounts.
- •Approved a request to spend \$34,000-\$36,000 to repair the church house gutters, downspouts and roof.
- •Approved a request to donate two unused pianos to Iglesia Emanuel
- •Discussed developing and process for handling petitions;
- •Formed a task forced to develop a safety plan for the staff and Dayschool during the week, and for worshipers on Sundays;
- Elected *Kate Busa* and *Alice Raney* to represent FPC as commissioners at the March 5th Presbytery meeting
