Dear Friends,

LETTER TO THE GOVERNOR

Unanimously, at their called meeting on April 18, the FPC Session approved making copies of a letter prepared by Coalition for Health Care of NC available to the congregation to sign. They discerned that this letter, commended to us by our sister church, Covenant Presbyterian, and endorsed by them and the NC Council of Churches, is in alignment with FPC's core values. **Members may sign a letter, or not, at one's discretion, and put it in the yellow box in the foyer.** A representative from the NC Coalition for Health Care will pick up the signed letters after May 15 and deliver them to the Governor.

Estate planning and preparing a will are not at the top of anyone's to-do list. However, it is critical that such decisions be made and recorded so that one's intentions are communicated clearly.

It was important to me to recognize the people and organizations that mean the most to me, so I planned for a gift to my undergraduate school (Davidson College), and the UNC Gillings School of Global Public Health, and most importantly First Presbyterian Church, Durham.

People, places, and experiences throughout our lives create the tapestry of who we become. My family and friends, and my church and my education, have made me the person that I am today – and for that I am very grateful. I never thought of myself as having a legacy. However, if I look at what I value in my life – my work in the community to help end homelessness and improve access to health care for those who are underserved, my church family, and my planned gifts to allow others to pursue their potential through education – then maybe *that* is a legacy? I like to think so.
