

FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear friends,

This Sunday we embark on our annual stewardship season with Mindy Douglas as our head of staff. The Stewardship Committee chose the familiar text from Luke 12:34 as its theme: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. "The committee believes that open hearts lead to compassionate giving. The loving heart is the open heart of generosity, for it is the real treasure that leads to generosity. Yet, I still hear occasionally from folks who hear the word stewardship and see it as code language for getting Presbyterians to dig deep and give more money. It does sadden me, especially since members of our community have worked so hard over the years to develop a scripturally-based understanding of stewardship that is much broader than a narrow focus on money.

At all worship services for the next five weeks, members of our congregation will give brief talks witnessing to how they have come to understand stewardship in a very inclusive way that includes their time, energy and money. They will speak in their own words to how they have embraced stewardship as a core value of this church and as a way of life, discovering the rich spirituality that has touched every aspect of their lives. They will speak to the connections between developing a sense of gratitude to God for their many blessings and a growing sense of responsibility to share those blessings more generously with others.

We believe that all we possess is given to us by God to be cared for, developed, and shared for the common good. May we all learn this season that the loving and grateful heart is the open heart of generosity!
