The *bulletin cover*, titled *Trinity* (Троица), was believed to be created by Russian painter Andrei Rublev in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. *Trinity* depicts the three visitors to Abraham and Sarah at the oaks of Mamre (cf. Genesis 18:1–15). It has often been interpreted as an icon of the Holy Trinity.
