



WHO: Saints (and sinners) from the congregations of First Presbyterian Church and Covenant Presbyterian Church of Durham. You must be at least 14 years old to go. If you are under age 16, a parent or guardian must travel with you.

WHY THIS TRIP, NOW:

This trip is funded by the Lilly Clergy Renewal Grant awarded to Rev. Mindy Douglas and First Presbyterian Church for the summer 2019. The grant provides for a total of 50 persons (ideally 25 from each church) to come together to enjoy the adventure of traveling, learn more about our common history, and grow in faith together.

COST: \$5 per person to reserve a seat. This seat deposit along with the grant funds will cover the train fare, lunch, museum guide, and entrance fee. Train tickets, once purchased, are name specific and non-transferable.

DEADLINE FOR SIGNING UP TO GO:

This trip will be filled on a first come, first served basis starting May 19th. Registration is open until June 20th <u>OR</u> whenever there are 25 persons signed up from each church. A waiting list will be kept in case either church is unable to sign up 25 persons.
