Yesterday (as I write) being February 29, Leap Day, an extra day to observe Black History Month, I am aware of the convergence of two overlapping events of then and now. The 100th anniversary year of FPC's sanctuary, built and dedicated in April of 1916, is commemorated by a time-line beautifully displayed in our foyer, and also by photographs newly added in the church narthex, both entry points for our many visitors and guests. Julie Maxwell, the graphic genius behind both displays, reminded me of the "predominantly white" message that both convey, as they reflect the ecclesial and racial tenor of that era, e.g. - segregation. But that was then.

This is now. Our McPherson lecturer this past weekend, Douglas Ottati, taught and preached about "the peculiar institution of grace" which the church is called to be in its practice of radical hospitality, in the way of Jesus, who regularly dined with sinners and tax collectors, etc. I would like to think that 100 years past 1916, as we look at the FPC of the present and future, that our timeline will begin to look much different as we continue to open our doors to the world which God so loved, and which Jesus so included. If you can think of ways to reflect that in our foyer and narthex displays, please let me or Julie know. We want to reflect history accurately, but we also want to project the church which Christ is calling us to be in the here and now.
