FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

"Good News" is the meaning of the word "gospel" and the gospel is the story of the life, passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. Gospel or "Good News" is always a story woven with the threads of an unexpected good gift in the fabric of brokenness and pain.

The "Good News" began as a startling word to parents about an unplanned pregnancy. It continued to unfold as the child was born to sojourners far from home, and finally when the family became refugees fleeing the murderous wrath of a tyrant. The Good News is found in chaos.

Jesus' proclamation of "Good News" was to ordinary peasants in Galilee, and his ministry was to the oppressed and sick. Jesus claimed God's realm is close at hand even though Rome controlled the government and hypocrites populated the religious establishment. God's goodness and justice and love were accessible despite how circumstances appeared. The Gospel, the "Good News," was about Life, it was about Life now, and it was to be shared with all.

"Good News" never denied the reality of pain or brokenness. It never promised to protect one from the effects of evil. And so the story of Holy Week proclaims the "Good News" of love confronting hate, of goodness facing injustice, of Life embracing death. It is a frightening story because the news doesn't look so good.

That is the meaning of Easter and the story of the resurrection ~ that is the "Good News": Life wins, love triumphs, and God's realm continues to be close at hand so that now, today, we may have Life

It is Life characterized by joy and healing. It is Life that overcomes death's illegitimate claims. It is Life that overflows with love and justice and hope. It is Life to be shared by all.

I pray this Easter we shall all hear again, and be grasped by, the "Good News" of God's love in Jesus.
