

FROM THE PASTOR

This week was full of historic firsts at the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), held in Portland, Oregon. The assembly, made up of more than five hundred voting commissioners from across the country and several hundred more advisory delegates, elected the first co-moderators (the first leadership pair made up of two women, one black and one white) Denise Anderson and Jan Edmiston (a N.C. native from down the street). They elected the first African-American stated clerk, J. Herbert Nelson. After six years of conversation and debate, the Assembly approved the Belhar Confession as the most recent addition to our Book of Confessions, and the only confession from the global south. Godfrey Betha, vice moderator of the Uniting Reformed Church of South Africa, addressed the Assembly on Wednesday night following the historic vote, saying, "Your decision affirms you say to your children, you say to all, 'When you come to us looking for a glimmer of racism, don't come to our church.'"

AMEN! The Assembly roared with applause. It was a glorious moment.

In the weeks and months ahead, you will be seeing portions of the Belhar Confession in worship some Sundays as we get accustomed to our new confession. I include here a portion of section 4 to get you started thinking about the kind of confession this is. I am proud and happy to be a part of a denomination supporting and claiming as our own such a confession. May we all continue to seek justice in our communities and in our world.

A portion of **The Belhar Confession:**

We believe

- that God has revealed himself as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people;
- that God, in a world full of injustice and enmity, is in a special way the God of the destitute, the poor and the wronged;
- that God calls the church to follow him in this, for God brings justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry;
- that God frees the prisoner and restores sight to the blind;
- that God supports the downtrodden, protects the stranger, helps orphans and widows and blocks the path of the ungodly;
- that for God pure and undefiled religion is to visit the orphans and the widows in their suffering;
- that the church must therefore stand by people in any form of suffering and need, which implies, among other things, that the church must witness against and strive against any form of injustice, so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream . . .
- that the church as the possession of God must stand where the Lord stands, namely against injustice and with the wronged; that in following Christ the church must witness against all the powerful and privileged who selfishly seek their own interests and thus control and harm others.



DRIVERS NEEDED FOR MIGRANT WORKERS

FLOC and Triangle Friends of Farmworkers (TFF) are seeking volunteers who would be able to – depending on their schedules – drive farmworkers to and from three critical FLOC Regional meetings in August or September, 2016 (schedule TBD later this summer). As you probably know, very few farmworkers have their own transportation – volunteer drivers are the only way most farmworkers could attend. We are compiling a list of potential drivers, and would love to add your name.

Volunteers drive to workers camps (with specific directions provided by FLOC) to pick up specific workers, transport workers to the meeting in Dudley (for the Eastern meeting; Piedmont and Western venues TBD), listen in on the meeting, and transport workers back to their labor camp. (NOTE: in some cases, one-way transport may be helpful). These meetings will likely not be scheduled until mid-July.
