# INTERIM PASTOR

Speaking from his experience as a Croatian in a period of ethnic cleansing in Yugoslavia, theologian Mirsoslav Volf examines the tendency of humanity to dehumanize and devalue "the other" any who are different in terms of tribe or ethnicity or custom or religion. Articulating an alternate view of Christian theology in his book Exclusion and Embrace, Volf sees the appropriate response as embrace and reconciliation rather than repudiation and exclusion. As God has embraced us in Christ, so the Christian community is to embrace and engage in reconciliation. As he notes in his book, Volf thinks that is a tough sell in modern culture.

In our sermon this Sunday, we will look at two very different people from the New Testament and how their differences did not divide them but through Christ united them in something more significant than their political or social views. The text comes from Acts 16:4-15.

On another subject: Have you noticed how hot it has been in the sanctuary the past two Sundays? I sure have! The reason has been a thermostat that has not been functioning properly and the temperature has been much higher than it should be. This week, the thermostat is being replaced and the temperature for worship should be more comfortable! Since pulpit gowns don't come with air conditioning, I am pleased with this solution!

I do want to encourage you to dress comfortably and therefore more casually during the summer months. We are attempting to keep costs down, and comfortable attire (open shirts rather than coats and ties) will help us to do that more responsibly.
