

FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear friends,

Spending a week in God's great garden of Camp New Hope with 130 children and youth is always a high point of my year. Certainly I enjoy the camaraderie, the joyful sounds, the singing and dancing, and the passing on of favorite bible stories from one generation to the next. And certainly I am grateful to all of our FPC members who contributed to the success of last week's VCS. But I also cherish the opportunity for more personal one-on-one conversations with some of our youth and children while we are at camp for VCS is a relational experience for us, first and foremost.

A stand-out conversation for me this year took place between **Matthew Dickerson** (15) and me as I was driving him home from camp one afternoon. Unsolicited, he confessed to me how grateful he was for his grandmother, **Celia Dickerson**, who had taken him and his siblings under her wing for seven years, and taught them the value of education and its power to change their lives. He could not stop singing his grandmother's praises in that twenty-minute exchange between us. And I was so moved by his maturity at this point in his young life to acknowledge God's spiritual gifts that have flowed through Celia to him and his siblings for their nurture and well-being. Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control: we sang a song about these spiritual gifts at VCS. They are ours to employ through the power of the Holy Spirit. I will talk about these spiritual gifts on Sunday, which are freely given for the relational ministry to which we have been called.

FLOC and Triangle Friends of Farmworkers (TFF) are seeking volunteers who would be able to – depending on their schedules – drive farmworkers to and from three critical FLOC Regional meetings in August or September, 2016 (schedule TBD later this summer). As you probably know, very few farmworkers have their own transportation – volunteer drivers are the only way most farmworkers could attend. We are compiling a list of potential drivers, and would love to add your name.

Volunteers would drive to workers' camps (with specific directions provided by FLOC) to pick up specific workers, transport workers to the meeting in Dudley (for the Eastern meeting; Piedmont and Western venues TBD), listen in on the meeting, and transport workers back to their labor camp. (NOTE: in some cases, one-way transport may be helpful). These meetings will likely not be scheduled until mid-July.
