FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

Love people even in their sin, for that is the semblance of Divine Love and is the highest love on earth. Love all of God's creation, the whole and every grain of sand of it. Once you perceive it, you will begin to comprehend it better every day. And you will come at last to love the whole world with an allembracing love. - Fyodor Dostoyevsky, The Brothers Karamazov

My son started working as a server in a restaurant this summer. In his work, he has learned a valuable lesson - that some people do not see servers as human beings. People come in and out of the restaurant and care only what he can do for them and how quickly and efficiently he responds to their needs. Too many do not see him as a person with feelings or even with thoughts. Few people stop to perceive in him "the divine mystery in things." For my son, this is a temporary annoyance, but many in our world spend their lives being invisible to the world in this way.

As we move through our lives, do we pause for long enough to see God in the other - God in the light, God in the darkness, God in the breeze, God in the stillness, God in the server, God in the one being served, God in ourselves, God in the other?

"If you love everything, you will perceive the divine mystery in things," writes Dostoyevsky. I think the reverse is the greater truth, "If you perceive the divine mystery in things, you will love everything."

May we seek to perceive the divine mystery in all things and all people we encounter this week. In so doing, may we discover God anew and be blessed by God's presence.
