

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving weekend and celebrated the beginning of Advent in worship and prayerful reflection. Advent is a gift to us at this time of year, you know. When the world around us is either caught up in the chaos of war, consumed by hatred for opposing factions, or wrapped in fear over what is or what will be; when those we love, or we ourselves, are lost in a deep personal grief, fighting an inner battle of addiction or lack of self-worth, or longing for love in whatever form it might take; when the hunger, poverty, abuse, and need around us seems so intense; when the stores and advertisements make it seem that all can be remedied by consumerism, Advent invites us to pause.



The book of Isaiah is my favorite place to live during Advent. In the reading from Sunday, the first Sunday in Advent, the prophet talks about the mountain of the Lord (Isaiah 2:1-5). It is the highest mountain, the holiest mountain, and the one the people long for. In fact, in the "days to come" people will stream to this mountain. They go to the mountain of the Lord so that God will teach them how to live and that they may walk in the paths of God, the light of the Lord. John August Swanson painted the image above, which has now also been turned into a serigraph. This image reminds me of this passage, with all the people streaming toward the mountain of peace and hope, bearing the light of God with them to the holy mountain.

During Advent, this passage and this image should give us hope – hope that all will be well and all will be well and all manner of things will be well. We live toward that hope. We work toward that future promise of peace. We walk in the light of the Lord.

Wherever you are on your journey, may this Advent bring you deep peace,

Members aged 70½ + who own an IRA may be able to make a qualified charitable distribution directly to First Presbyterian from your IRA and have that gift satisfy any required minimum distribution for this year. Please contact your IRA administrator ASAP if you wish to consider this giving option for tax year 2016 (the gift must be delivered directly to FPC by the IRA plan administrator, postmarked on or before December 31, 2016).
