# THE HUNGER FOR CHANGE OFFERING

First Presbyterian has a long history of involvement in hunger-related mission, most notably Pennies for Hunger and Durham's CROP Hunger Walk. In addition, we encourage members to volunteer at the Community Kitchen at Urban Ministries of Durham, with Meals on Wheels, and at the Food Bank of Central and Eastern NC. We also collect items for the food pantry at Iglesia Hispana Emanuel. Our youth sponsor the annual Souper Bowl of Caring to raise money for hunger-related missions. We also encourage giving to the One Great Hour of Sharing Hunger Offering on Easter Sunday which funds mission activities related to disaster assistance and hunger programs locally and around the world.

The funds received from our Hunger for Change Offering go to the New Hope Presbytery for the Presbyterian Hunger Relief Program and is divided as follows:

50% - International Hunger Relief Programs

40% - Local Hunger Programs

10% - Administration.

These funds are dispersed through local grants to hunger relief programs based on a grant application process. Urban Ministries of Durham, Presbyterian Urban Ministries and Iglesia Hispana Emanuel have been frequent recipients.

If your family committed to saving a **Penny**/day each month, you'd be donating about \$0.30 per month or \$3.65 for the entire year. That's not much in the face of the rising need. Save a **Nickel**/day, and you can contribute \$1.50 per month. A **Dime**/day will generate \$3.00 and a **Quarter**/a day will generate \$7.50 per month.

The fourth Sunday of each month is designated to receive the Hunger for Change Offering. Please consider supporting this hunger relief effort with a generous offering today.

### WELCOMING OUR NEIGHBORS AND FRIENDS

On Sunday mornings First Presbyterian Church (FPC) gives thanks for those God brings our way and wants to welcome all people with warmth and hospitality, regardless of their life circumstance. Occasionally, a visitor may ask for money or food. Members and friends want to help, but may not know what the right response should be.

In order to help our members and friends receive our visitors with grace and love, while also recognizing certain restrictions and boundaries we have on Sundays, we recently compiled the following information for those times when a visitor asks for assistance:

- **a.** Food, immediately: Free, hot lunch is available on Saturdays and Sundays from 12:30-1:30 at Urban Ministries of Durham.\* Blessing bags (i.e. snack bags) from FPC are available only during the week.
- **b. Food, long term:** Urban Ministries of Durham food pantry is open 9-11 a.m. Monday-Thursday. They provide three meals a day, every day.\* No one should be hungry in Durham.
- c. Clothing: Urban Ministries of Durham clothes closet is open 9-11 a.m. Monday-Thursday.
- **d.** Bus passes: Along with other forms of assistance, bus passes can be requested at FPC on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and noon at our Walk-in Ministry.\*\* We do not offer this assistance on Sundays.
- e. Requests for money: For many reasons, please do not give out cash. FPC does not give cash.
- **f. Request to meet with pastor**: Pastoral appointments can be made through our Monday and Thursday Walk-in Ministry volunteers.
- **g.** Needing prayer or prayerful listening: We are working on putting together a prayer team that will be available following worship for those who need prayer or someone to just talk to for a bit. Stay tuned for more information!

Most of all, we want to always treat our visitors with dignity and respect, showing kindness and compassion and giving a listening ear. If at any time, however, someone becomes agitated or angry, please ask them to leave or find someone else who can ask them to leave.

<sup>\*</sup>Urban Ministries of Durham is located on 410 Liberty Street, behind St. Philip's Episcopal Church, one block from the FPC parking lot. Monday-Friday – breakfast and lunch bag 8-9 a.m., dinner 7-8 p.m., Saturday-Sunday – breakfast 9:30-10:30 a.m., lunch 12:30-1:30 p.m., dinner 6-7 p.m. Note: Your stewardship dollars provide financial support to Urban Ministries through our Service and Mission budget.
