Dear Friends,

On Friday, my husband and I had the unique experience of attending the naturalization ceremony in Durham of our son's mother-in-law, Qiuyi Chi, as she became an American citizen. It was a wonderful ceremony where 56 individuals, representing 28 countries, took the Oath of Allegiance, vowed the Pledge of Allegiance, received their certificates of US citizenship, and registered to vote. I found myself drinking the purple Kool-Aid of patriotism as I sang our National Anthem, clapped along with the John Philips Sousa march, placed my hand on my heart for the pledge, and teared-up while watching the *America the Beautiful* video. But what captured my attention most was the cursive inscription on the wall above our heads that said, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free," from Emma Lazarus' sonnet on the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty, which ends with the phrase, "I lift my lamp beside *the golden door!*"

Jesus was the original Golden Door, *The Gate*, he calls himself in John's Gospel; The Gate to salvation, to green pastures, and to life abundant. Perhaps I should tear-up when I hear these words, too, and see them played out as FPC welcomes our guests, as we welcome our confirmands this Sunday, as we welcome new members, as we greet one another in Christ. I look forward to greeting you at *the door* this Sunday.

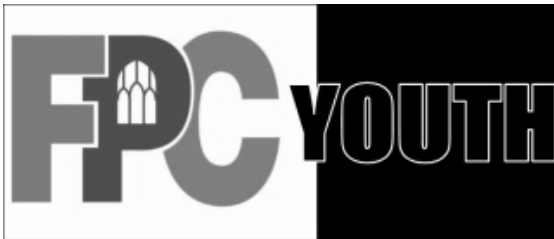
