From the Pastor . . .

Dear friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses on the door of the Wittenberg Church in Germany to invite conversation about some things that the Roman Catholic Church was doing that didn't seem to mesh with Scripture. Luther didn't intend to start a new church, but in the end, his words and actions and the words and actions of many others started new communities of worship which spun off into Protestant denominations in the years, decades, and centuries that followed.

The motto of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is *ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda* – "The Church reformed, always reforming." The Reformers did not understand this phrase to mean change for the sake of change, but rather a return to Scripture as the primary basis for understanding God and God's call to the church. Writes Anna Case-Winters:

[O]ne of the serious charges church authorities hurled at the Reformers was that they were "innovating." John Calvin responded to this and other charges in his treatise "The Necessity of Reforming the Church." As he put it, "We are accused of rash and impious innovation for having ventured to propose any change at all [in] the former state of the Church." He then goes on to counter that they were not "innovating," but restoring the church to its true nature, purified from the "innovations" that riddled the church through centuries of inattention to Scripture and theological laxity.

As members of this church which is reformed but always reforming, we hold fast to that which is theologically sound and guided by the gospel of Jesus Christ. We do not, however, fear change or innovation when it helps us to be true to sharing the Good News of the Gospel in our time and in this place. We seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit through constant study and prayerful discernment. We worship, serve, and learn together in community, so that we might hear the voices of all God's people as we seek to understand who God would have us be and what God would have us do here in the heart of Durham.

This Sunday is also our Stewardship Dedication Sunday. We are grateful stewards of all that God has given us. We invite you to make your pledge to the work of this church on or before this Sunday and during worship we will have a time for folks to come forward and dedicate their gifts of time, talent, and resources to God. If you have already made your pledge online, in person, or by mail, come forward as a way to spiritually connect with God, giving thanks for all you have been given and dedicating your life to following Jesus.

This Sunday is a day to look back at the formation of our church history and theology and to look forward toward all the ways God will call us to love, live, and grow in this place in the years ahead.

May the God who has guided us this far, guide us in our future together.
