On Sunday, December 17 we welcomed 37 visitors to our worship service.

The *poinsettias* are given to the glory of God and are a gift to the congregation from *Arthur and Mary Clark*. *Special thanks* to *Alice Raney, Dale Georgiade, Brent Curtis, and Robert Daye* for decorating the sanctuary for the season.

The striking *Advent paraments*, a gift from Anne St. Clair Williams, were designed and created in 2012 by Laurie Wohl, a fiber-artist internationally known for her "Unweavings."

The *sanctuary table* upon which the Advent Wreath sits was made by *George Danser* and is given to us by him and his wife, *Jean Cary*.

Nursery care for infants—children 6 years of age is provided during worship on the second floor of the Christian Education Building. After the sermon is delivered, the 3-6 year old children join worship for the remainder of service or return to the nursery. There is an *infant changing table* in the narthex, located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.

Hearing Assistance Receivers are available from the ushers. Before you leave the sanctuary please turn off the receiver and place it in the specially marked receptacle near the baptism font.
