**MUSIC NOTES:** *Kathy Parkins* is on vacation this Sunday. We welcome the following musicians to our service and thank them for sharing their gifts:

Gordon Campbell, guest organist, started his organ studies in Morgantown, WV at the age of 12. He continued to study while the family lived in Nairobi, Kenya and then returned to Morgantown where he became a student of Clyde English at West Virginia University and the organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Morgantown. At First Presbyterian, he accompanied multiple choirs and frequently played with a brass quintet and other instrumental groups. After a break of several decades, an invitation to play Christmas service at a church in rural England got him back to practicing regularly and now he is enjoying every opportunity to play at FPC, Durham.

*Caleb Connor*, baritone, has been attending First Presbyterian since before he was born.
