We welcome to the pulpit today the Rev. Dr. Steve Eason. Eason received a B.A. from East Carolina University in 1976, M. Div. from Duke Divinity School in 1979 and D. Min. from Columbia Theological Seminary in 1993. He was ordained in the United Methodist Church in 1980 and transferred to the PC(USA) in 1984. He has served as pastor/head of staff at churches of different sizes and his longest tenure was from 2002-2015 at Myers Park Presbyterian in Charlotte, NC. Eason has also served as interim pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Richmond, Virginia and currently serves as interim pastor of Sequoyah Hills Presbyterian Church in Knoxville, Tennessee. Eason has been married to Catherine since 1977 and they have three adult children and four grandchildren. Eason's visit is made possible through the McPherson Lectureship Fund.

We also welcome to worship today the Confirmation Class from Judea Reform Congregation, Durham. FPC's Confirmation Class is worshipping at St. Barbara Greek Orthodox Church this morning.


