First Presbyterian Church welcomes all who worship here. We honor and celebrate the human diversity and unity that God gives us in Christ. We welcome individuals of every age, race, nationality, gender, ability, sexual orientation, and economic circumstance to participate fully in the life of the church. So that we may better know each other, please sign the Ritual of Friendship pad, pass it along the center pew across to the shorter side pew, and then return it to the starting point, noting the names of those sitting near you. On Sunday, December 30, we welcomed 12 visitors to our worship service.

Music Notes: Our Prelude for today's worship is an arrangement of the Christmas carol Gaudete, which was first published (with Latin lyrics) in 1581 in Piae Cantiones, a collection of Finnish and Swedish sacred songs. The lyrics are "Rejoice, rejoice! Christ is born of the Virgin Mary. Rejoice!" Our Offertory is even older: In Dulci Jubilo was written in the 14th century with a mixture of Latin and Medieval German lyrics. We know the tune as Good Christian Friends, Rejoice (#132 in our hymnal). We are grateful to the First Presbyterian Wind Ensemble (Christyn Klinck, Joe Robinson, Brent Curtis, and David Smith) for their musical contribution to today's service.

Nursery care for infants to 6 years of age is provided during worship on the second floor of the Education Building. There is a changing table in the narthex, located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.

Worship bags and activity bulletins are available in the foyer for children. Books are on the pews in the narthex for younger children to read and enjoy should they need a break from the service.

Portions of today's worship texts were reprinted from Book of Common Worship, Eucharistic Prayers, and Feasting on the Word.






