Cereal (cold or hot, in multiple regular-size boxes rather than extra-large ones) Granola bars and cereal bars (preferably large boxes like sold at Sam's or Costco) Fruit cups (large boxes)

Peanut butter (small jars, preferably whole flats)

Macaroni and cheese

Cup a noodles/ramen noodles (preferably large packages like sold at Sam's)

Spaghetti or any kind of pasta (preferably multiple small boxes)

Canned vegetables (preferably whole flats of small cans, green beans and corn)

Canned soup, tuna, Spaghetti-Os or other protein-rich or whole meal item.
