


Tired of waiting until we can be in person again?

KEEP THESE DONATIONS COMING!

Our local food pantries have been flooded with requests for basic sanitation items that have become hard to come by in the pandemic, but they have not had enough to meet the demand. To answer this urgent need, Durham Congregations in Action (DCIA) has launched a hygiene drive to keep our partner pantries fully stocked with the supplies Durhamites need.

They are seeking the following items:

- CDC-approved disinfectant wipes or sprays (Lysol, Scrubbing Bubbles, Clorox)
- · hand sanitizer
- · empty spray bottles
- paper towels
- toilet paper
- feminine hygiene products
- hand and body soap

If you can donate any of these, they can be dropped off at any of these partner congregations, from which the supplies will be delivered to area food pantries for distribution to our Durham neighbors!

REAL stories - REAL people

During the 20-21 year, REAL will be our process and our theme



R=Remember and retrieval

Remember and retrieval: What do we know about this story or person in the in the Bible? Possible activities: drawing, writing, use of whiteboards for brainstorming, talking, etc.



E=Explore/Explain the particulars of the person or story

Read the text from various sources, watch a video, look at artwork



A=Access and Elaborate

Allow and encourage students to find out more about the context, person or story.

Use technology tools to get more information, record and share back to larger group



L=Learn/Leave

Encourage and allow for each person to say something that they learned or appreciated during the lesson. Encourage and allow students to talk about their upcoming week or day, or say something they are looking forward to.



FAITH FORMATION

Faith formation is essential to the church's mission and needs to be flexible but consistent in this time of major upheaval and loss of familiar routines. A structured lesson plan will provide familiarity to students, and ease of planning for teachers, whether there is a curriculum or not.
