Bag Rice and Beans for the Food Pantry at Iglesia Emanuel:

Duke Chapel offers VOICE CARE VOCAL WORKSHOP

Duke Chapel has partnered with the Duke Voice Care Center to offer a free, online vocal health workshop, titled Singing Voice Health During COVID-19 and Beyond. There will be two sessions, both on Wednesdays, from 7:00-8:00 pm. The first session on September 23 will focus on the anatomy of the singing voice, how voice injuries are treated, and how to keep one's voice healthy. The October 14 session will cover the development of healthy vocal habits, agerelated voice changes, an introduction to basic vocal conditioning exercises, and tips to keep one's voice "in shape" during COVID-19. The sessions will be presented by Dr. Audrey Walstrom, CCC-SLP, a clinical singing voice specialist at the Duke Voice Care Center who also holds MM and DMA degrees in voice performance from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music.
