### "Time Out" Radio Show



## **Tour Historic Stagville**

The Faith & Community Class will tour Historic Stagville again on **Saturday**, **July 17 from 8:00-10:00 a.m.** NOTE: This tour replaces the July 10<sup>th</sup> tour which has been cancelled. FPC's own *Vera Cecelski* will lead this tour which is limited to 20 persons. Please sign up (<u>here</u>) in advance if you plan to take this tour. Stagville is a state historic site located in Durham that includes the remnants of the one of the largest plantations in North Carolina. The site consists of original slave quarters (1851), a massive barn (1860), and a Bennehan family house (1787-1799). Stagville is dedicated to teaching about the lives and work of plantation slaves.

# **FPC Sponsors Community Blood Drive**


There is a critical blood shortage right now because of the lingering pandemic. FPC will host a Community Blood Drive with the American Red Cross on Thursday, July 29 from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Watts-Hill Hall (305. E. Main Street). redcrossblood.org with sponsor code: firstpres. Each donor who participates in FPC's blood drive will be eligible to receive a \$10 Amazon gift card. Contact FPC's coordinator, *Julie Whiddon*, if you wish to help with the drive or have questions about donating blood. Beginning Sunday, July 11, you will be able to sign up following worship at the table in the church foyer. FPC has a goal to fill 30 appointment slots during this drive. Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with types O negative, B negative, and A negative. According to the Red Cross, type O negative is the universal blood type that can be safely transfused to anyone and is often used to treat trauma patients. Please sign up to give blood and help save a life.
