

Tour Historic Stagville

The Faith & Community Class will tour Historic Stagville again on **Saturday**, **July 17 from 8:00-10:00 a.m.** FPC's own *Vera Cecelski* will lead this tour which is limited to 25 persons. Stagville is a state historic site located in Durham that includes the remnants of the one of the largest plantations in North Carolina. The site consists of original slave quarters (1851), a massive barn (1860), and a Bennehan family house (1787-1799). Stagville is dedicated to teaching about the lives and work of plantation slaves.

Discussion Leaders Needed for Faith & Community Class

Later this summer, we're continuing to learn and understand the stories of race in our country. Following *The Best of Enemies*, the Faith & Community class will be watching Henry Louis Gates Jr.'s documentary, *The Black Church: This Is Our Story, This Is Our Song*. FPC Sponsors Community Blood Drive

There is a critical blood shortage right now because of the lingering pandemic. FPC will host a Community Blood Drive with the American Red Cross on Thursday, July 29 from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Watts-Hill Hall. Today following worship, you will be able to sign up at the table in the church foyer. FPC has a goal to fill 30 appointment slots during this drive. Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with types O negative, B negative, and A negative. According to the Red Cross, type O negative is the universal blood type that can be safely transfused to anyone and is often used to treat trauma patients. To sign up online, go to

635 Sing, Praise, and Bless the Lord






