# **FPC Sponsors Community Blood Drive**

There is a critical blood shortage right now because of the lingering pandemic. FPC will host a Community Blood Drive with the American Red Cross on Thursday, July 29 from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Watts-Hill Hall. Today following worship, you will be able to sign up at the table in the church foyer. FPC has a goal to fill 30 appointment slots during this drive. Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with types O negative, B negative, and A negative.

According to the Red Cross, type O negative is the universal blood type that can be safely transfused to anyone and is often used to treat trauma patients. To sign up online, go to *redcrossblood.org* and use sponsor code: **firstpres**. Each donor who participates in FPC's blood drive will be eligible to receive a \$10 Amazon gift card from the Red Cross. Contact FPC's coordinator, *Julie Whiddon*, if you wish to help with the drive or have questions about donating blood.
