EPISTLE LESSON

Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. ³ He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴ having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

⁵Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. ⁶But someone has testified somewhere, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them? ⁷ You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, ⁸ subjecting all things under their feet."

Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, ⁹ but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

¹⁰ It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. ¹¹ For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them siblings, ¹² saying, "I will proclaim your name to my siblings, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."

You are invited to follow them, maintaining a safe distance between one another. In the courtyard you will be given a piece of bread and will pick up a cup of juice. We will partake together at the direction of one of the ministers.

For those at home: We invite you to have bread or a cracker and juice, water, or wine for the sacrament of holy communion. As the in-person congregation processes to the courtyard, Kathy Parkins will play the organ and then one of our pastors will invite you to partake of the elements in your home.



Welcome! Let us know you have joined us for worship by scanning this QR code. First Presbyterian Church welcomes all who worship with us. We honor and celebrate the human diversity and unity that God gives us in Christ. We welcome individuals of every age, race, nationality, gender identity, ability, sexual orientation, and economic

circumstance to participate fully in the life of the church. On September 26, 57 joined us for inperson worship and 43 households tuned in to the live-streamed broadcast.

Music Notes: The Prelude by Italian composer Benedetto Marcello (1686-1739) was originally a choral arrangement of Psalm 19, one of Marcello's settings of the first fifty Psalms. The Response after the Sermon is an arrangement, originally for organ, of the familiar tune McKee (#317 in our hymnal), by American composer Carlton R. Young, using slightly jazzy rhythms. (If there is room in Christ for East, West, South, and North, there is certainly room for different musical styles.)

We are grateful to *Franzi Rokoske* and *Drew Cummings* for sharing with us their gifts in song and the *First Presbyterian Wind Quintet (Christyn Klinck, Sheya Wehrman, Li-Chen Chin, Brent Curtis, and David Smith)* for their contribution to today's service.
