We honor and celebrate the human diversity and unity that God gives us in Christ. Music Note: In addition to stirring up controversy in the established church, Martin Luther was a prolific hymn writer and the author and composter of "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." This "Battle Hymn of the Reformation" is popular among Protestants. Written between 1527 and 1529, it is a metrical setting of Psalm 46 (God is our refuge and strength) and has appeared continuously in hymnals since 1531.

The *liturgical color for Reformation* is red. Red signifies both the Holy Spirit, which reforms and continues to reform us, and is also the color for martyrs, remembering those who lost their lives in pursuit of reforming the church.

The *flowers* in the sanctuary are given to the glory of God in memory of *Craig McNab*, husband of *Laura McNab*.

Many thanks to *John Fricks*, *Jody Maxwell*, and *Keith Rokoske* for their technical assistance with our live broadcasts of worship on Sunday mornings.


