## An Interfaith Conversation on Book of Job and Suffering

To whom or what can we turn for help in finding meaning in suffering? What kind of message are we likely to find comforting? The biblical Book of Job offers profound reflections on these questions. In two sessions, *Rabbi Daniel Greyber* from Beth El Synagogue and FPC member *Jerry Postema* will explore Job's struggle with the help of Rabbi Harold S. Kushner's book: *The Book of Job: When Bad Things Happen to a Good Person*.


