We welcome to the pulpit today the ***Rev. Joseph Harvard***, pastor emeritus of FPC. Joe retired in 2013 after serving as pastor for more than 30 years. He and wife Carlisle remain active in the community, supporting non-profit organizations that are near and dear to their hearts.

We welcome back to the organ our minister of music, ***Kathy Parkin,s*** who has been traveling, attending conferences, and taking some much-needed time off this summer.

We also welcome and express our gratitude to ***Ginger Jones-Robinson***, acclaimed soprano, for leading our worship in song.

Today we celebrate ***John Fricks*** who is retiring from the volunteer position of “Sound Guy” for the church. John shares these memories with us:

Soon after ***Sue*** and I came to First Presbyterian in 1993, ***Esther Pardue*** coaxed me to join the Worship and Music Committee. She had a schedule of the months when I would participate in worship planning, but the real intent, I believe, was to have me line up volunteers to operate sound. Here we are, today, almost 30 years later.

In the late nineties, ***Sarah Cox***, and ***Sarah Todd*** kept a fire burning under ***Joe Harvard*** and the session: Fix the sound system! The hearing assistance system was the first response. Some of the infrared receivers in use today go back to September 2001. I did the installation myself. On September 11, I was crawling around in dirty, dusty parts of the church basement to run cable between the sound cabinet and the choir loft. That’s where I was when airplanes crashed into the World Trade Center. Joe and ***Lori Pistor*** and other Durham ministers scrambled. The community-wide prayer service took place in this sanctuary that afternoon.

The ***flowers*** are given to the glory of God by ***Christy (Myers) and Jim Gudaitis*** and in honor of ***Mary Helm Myers*** on the occasion of her 89th birthday.

Hearing Assistance Receivers are available from the ushers. Before you leave the sanctuary, please turn off the receiver and place it in the specially marked receptacle by the door or return it to an usher.

Childcare: A staffed nursery and children’s playroom are available on the second floor of the education building during worship. ***Activity bags*** are available in the foyer for children.

Restrooms are to the left and right as you exit the rear of the sanctuary, on the second floor of the education building, and on the first and second floors of the church house. There is an infant changing table in the restroom area located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.
