

\$2.5 million!

As co-chairs of the Campaign, we are so excited to share the news that the congregation's response to-date has surpassed \$2.5 million. THANK YOU for this generous response!

Our Building Beloved Community Capital Campaign will advance our mission as we set our sights on our building expansion and renovation plans, estimated to cost \$3 million to \$4 million. Also, a portion of the gifts shared in the campaign (approximately \$50,000) will go to support a part time tutoring coordinator for three years at our sister congregation Iglesia Emanuel. AND... a portion of the gifts (approximately \$50,000) will fund the nonprofit RIP Medical Debt, resulting in \$5 million in debt relief for people living below 200% of the federal poverty level.

As our Building Beloved Campaign continues, we encourage everyone to return the campaign pledge form to the church office, bring it to the worship service, or respond online through our church website. Again, we are excited by the response to-date, and are hoping that all members can claim a share of what we are accomplishing together.
