FPC's Racial Equity Task Force has prioritized the importance of protecting access to voting and getting out the vote (GOTV) this fall as a strategy to foster equity. We're working with Democracy NC, a nonpartisan organization focused on voting

rights. The election is **Tuesday, November 8** and **early voting** begins on **Thursday, October 20** and ends at 3:00 p.m. on **Saturday, November 5**. There are 3 ways you can participate:
