Leader:

What does our faith demand?

Lectern side:

Racism is a lie about our fellow human beings, for it says that some are less than others. Because of our Biblical understanding of who God is and what God intends for humanity, we must stand against, speak against and work against racism. Anti-racist effort is not optional for Christians. It is an essential aspect of Christian discipleship, without which we fail to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

**Pulpit side:**

We must work to realize the fullness of this gift.

We will build, living stone by living stone, societies marked by justice and love. God calls us to reconciliation. We must repair that which we've broken.



### **Slide Show: Birds of Western Brazil**






