On Calvary's hill your Son redeemed us by the blood of your new covenant, and on the mountain in Galilee, he ascended to your right hand on high.


And so we gladly thank you, celebrating your glory with angels and archangels, and all the company of heaven,


### Continue to pray for and support earthquake victims in Syria and Turkey.


