



The *Pulpit Paraments*: In 2012 First Presbyterian Church commissioned Laurie Wohl to design and create paraments to be hung from the pulpit and lectern during Lent and Advent. Wohl is an internationally known fiber artist who exhibited her work at the church in spring of 2012. Her liturgical projects emphasize the "threads that bind" and the unity of the Old and New Testaments. We are grateful that the bequest of Anne 'St. Clair' Williams made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.

The *Lenten Banner* was completed in 1990 and dedicated in 1991. It depicts traditional Lenten symbols. The banner was made possible by funds donated in memory of *Bess Bryant* and by the stitching of many devoted members of this congregation.

Childcare: A staffed nursery and children's playroom are available on the second floor of the education building during worship. *Activity bags* are available in the foyer for children to use during worship.

The Annual McPherson Lectureship "Finding God in the Movies"

Please join us for the 2023 McPherson Lecture on Sunday, March 26, when husband and wife team Catherine Barsotti and Rob Johnston will discuss the theme: *Finding God in the Movies*. Their visit has been long delayed by Covid, so we are delighted to welcome them to Durham. The wider theme of their talks will be the ways we encounter God outside of church and scripture.



Dr. Catherine M. Barsotti (PhD, Fuller Theological Seminary) is affiliate assistant professor of interdisciplinary studies at Fuller Theological Seminary and a professor at Centro Hispano de Estudios Teológicos (CHET), a Latino ministry training center in Compton, California. She is a minister in the Evangelical Covenant Church and has worked in international community development, youth ministry, as a chaplain at a domestic violence center for women and children, and a mentor at a Latino ministry training center. Her teaching areas include theology, ethics, and spirituality (in Spanish), missiology, and theology and film (in Spanish and English).



Dr. Robert K. Johnston (PhD, Duke University) is Professor of Theology and Culture at Fuller Theological Seminary and a past President of the American Theological Society. His recent books

include God's Wider Presence: Reconsidering General Revelation (2014), Don't Stop Believin': Pop Culture and Religion from Ben Hur to Zombies (coedited with Craig Detweiler and Barry Taylor; 2012), Useless Beauty (2004), Finding God in the Movies (co-written with Catherine Barsotti; 2004), Life Is Not Work/Work Is Not Life (co-written with J. Walker Smith; 2001), and Reel Spirituality: Theology and Film in Dialogue (2000, 2nd ed. 2006).


