We welcome to the pulpit *Jimmie Hawkins*, the director of the PCUSA Office of Public Witness in Washington DC. Jimmie earned a Bachelor of Arts in Social Studies from North Carolina Central University (Durham, NC); a Master of Arts in Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (Richmond, VA); and a Master of Divinity from the /Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary (Atlanta, GA). For 20 years he served as the pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church in Durham. He has chaired several interfaith and ecumenical and non-profit boards. He has been active in justice advocacy throughout his ministry. His book, *Unbroken and Unbowed: A History of Black Protest in America,* was published by Westminster John Knox in February 2022, and will be the focus of a Lunch and Learn event tomorrow at noon in Watts-Hill Hall.
