Paraments during Ordinary Time: In the long season of Ordinary Time, stretching for about six months between Trinity Sunday in late spring and Advent in late fall, the liturgical color is green. As part of our 150th Anniversary celebration, we commissioned the creation of new green paraments, along with white paraments and a white communion tablecloth, from fabric artist Beth Taylor. The funds for this work were donated by our dear members Ruth and Russell Roberson in memory of their mothers. The paraments were displayed and dedicated during the 150th Anniversary commemoration on Sunday, May 1, 2022. You will see the green paraments on the pulpit and lectern for the remainder of this year's "green season." We are grateful to Ruth and Russell for their generous gift.

#### Fresh vegetables will be available at FPC beginning August 3




The Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program, done in partnership with Sankofa Farms in Orange County, is starting a six-week summer cycle on August 3. We had a very successful Spring CSA and are looking forward to a bounty of summer vegetables like tomatoes, squash, peppers, and much more during this cycle.

The CSA is a great way to have a steady supply of fresh healthy vegetables each week, grown sustainably by a farmer of color. The boxes of

vegetables will be delivered to First Pres every Thursday afternoon, beginning August 3, and be available for pickup between 3:30 and 5:30 p.m. in the church lobby, or at Westminster Pres from 6:00-7:30. This cycle will run for six weeks, from August 3-September 7. The cost is \$35 per week for a full share and \$25 for a half share. For the full six weeks it is \$210 for a full share and \$150 for a half share. If you wish to participate, go to the Sankofa Farms website, and once there, click on "Shop". #### **The Hunger for Change Offering**

You may use the small brown envelopes in the back of the pew for this offering.

First Presbyterian Church of Durham has a long history of involvement in hunger-related mission, most notably Pennies for Hunger (now Hunger for Change) and the Durham CROP Walk. In addition, we coordinate volunteers for the Community Kitchen at Urban Ministries of Durham, collect food for Iglesia Emanuel's Food Pantry, and the Food Bank of Central and Eastern NC. We also encourage giving to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering on Easter Sunday which funds mission activities related to disaster assistance and hunger relief programs locally and around the world.

The funds received from our Hunger for Change Offering go to the New Hope Presbytery for the Presbyterian Hunger Relief Program and are divided as follows:

50% - International Hunger Relief Programs

40% - Local Hunger Programs

10% - Administration.

These funds are dispersed through local grants to hunger relief programs based on a grant application process. Urban Ministries of Durham, Presbyterian Urban Ministries and Iglesia Emanuel are frequent recipients. FPC received a grant to purchase food supplies for our Walk-in Ministry.

The fourth Sunday of each month is designated to receive the Hunger for Change Offering. Please consider supporting this hunger relief effort with a generous offering each month.
