# Fresh vegetables will be available at FPC beginning August 3



The Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program, done in partnership with Sankofa Farms in Orange County, is starting a six-week summer cycle on August 3. We had a very successful Spring CSA and are looking forward to a bounty of summer vegetables like tomatoes, squash, peppers, and much more during this cycle.

The CSA is a great way to have a steady supply of fresh healthy vegetables each week, grown sustainably by a farmer of color. The boxes of

vegetables will be delivered to First Pres every Thursday afternoon, beginning August 3, and be available for pickup between 3:30 and 5:30 p.m. in the church lobby, or at Westminster Pres from 6:00-7:30. This cycle will run for six weeks, from August 3-September 7. The cost is \$35 per week for a full share and \$25 for a half share. For the full six weeks it is \$210 for a full share and \$150 for a half share. If you wish to participate, go to the Sankofa Farms website, and once there, click on "Shop."
