The *flowers* today are given to the glory of God and in memory of **Frances** and **Will Kennedy**, *Emily Wilkins'* parents.

This anthem is dedicated to the memory of those who lost their lives on 9/11. The composer went to Manhattan with his choir from Trinity Church Boston, two weeks after 9/11 to sing for the firemen at the fire stations that were most affected. At the third fire station, the choir was singing "O Beautiful for

Spacious Skies" and the composer/conductor looked up to see a fireman coming down a long stairway in the fire house. The fireman stopped halfway down the staircase and began weeping and stayed there for the duration of the of the singing. The composer learned that this was the Captain of the station and that he had been in the basement of the North Tower when the South Tower collapsed. The next day, a Sunday, the reading for the church service was the story of Jacob's Ladder. The composer wrote this setting as a new lens through which to see the stairways of 9/11 and a new way to see angels ascending and descending, always aware that "in the dark, a light is shining."

Childcare: A staffed nursery and children's playroom are available on the second floor of the education building during worship. *Activity bags* are available in the foyer for children. Please return bags to the foyer at the end of worship.

Restroom locations: To the left and right as you exit the rear of the sanctuary; on the second floor of the education building; and on the first and second floors of the church house. There is an infant changing table in the restroom area located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.

The *Lenten Banner* was completed in 1990 and dedicated in 1991. It depicts traditional Lenten symbols. The banner was made possible by funds donated in memory of *Bess Bryant* and by the stitching of many devoted members of this congregation.

The *Pulpit Paraments*: In 2012 First Presbyterian Church commissioned Laurie Wohl to design and create paraments to be hung from the pulpit and lectern during Lent and Advent. Wohl is an internationally known fiber artist who exhibited her work at the church in spring of 2012. Her liturgical projects emphasize the "threads that bind" and the unity of the Old and New Testaments. We are grateful that the bequest of *Anne 'St. Clair' Williams* made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.
