
THE GREAT THANKSGIVING





If you contributed to the cost of the lilies, you may take a lily with you following worship today. If you desire for your lily to be taken to a homebound church member, please leave it in the sanctuary so it can be delivered by members of the Diaconate. We also thank those of you who brought flowers and greenery to flower the cross.

Thank you to Laura Kelley, Anna Blair, Deborah Coclanis, and Ann Huff for sharing their musical gifts with us this morning.

Childcare: A staffed nursery and children's playroom are available on the second floor of the education building during worship. *Activity bags* are available in the foyer for children. Please return bags to the foyer at the end of worship.

Restroom locations: To the left and right as you exit the rear of the sanctuary; on the first and second floors of the education building; and on the first and second floors of the church house. There is an infant changing table in the restroom area located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.

The *Lenten Banner* was completed in 1990 and dedicated in 1991. It depicts traditional Lenten symbols. The banner was made possible by funds donated in memory of *Bess Bryant* and by the stitching of many devoted members of this congregation.

The paraments and communion tablecloth used in worship today were given by *Ruth and Russell Roberson* in memory of their mothers: *Zenobia Teresa Cox Haislip* and *Myrtle Taylor Roberson*, both of whom were quilters, for the 150th Anniversary of the founding of First Presbyterian Church of Durham, North Carolina December 31,1871 - December 31, 2021. They were designed and sewn by *Beth Taylor*, a fabric artist and modern quilter. She created the unique communion cloth and paraments for First Presbyterian by including personal items of meaning and significance donated by members. Beth and her husband *Robert Parker* are former members of First Presbyterian Church and now live in the mountains of Virginia.

 \star *The Lord's Prayer when Holy Communion is celebrated:* From the beginning, one of the hallmarks of Reformed worship has been liturgy in the vernacular—in the common language of the people of God. Many, however, continue to use the language of another era (the Tudor dynasty) when praying the prayer Jesus taught. We hope that by using this ecumenical version, new generations will learn and understand this prayer in a fresh way.

Notes on the anthem: **Ralph Vaughan-Williams** composed this anthem in 1911 using the beautiful text by English metaphysical poet, George Herbert. Herbert was born in 1593 into a Welsh family and moved to England and became a priest. He is known as one of the foremost devotional poets of his age. This anthem was originally composed for choir and orchestra and this arrangement with one piano, four hands, is extremely true to the original musical notation. We are fortunate to have two fine pianists who can accompany us.


