We honor and celebrate the human diversity and unity that God gives us in Jesus Christ. First Presbyterian welcomes individuals of every age, race, nationality, gender identity, ability, sexual orientation, and economic circumstance to participate fully in the life of the church. So that you may know who is sitting nearby, please sign the *Friendship Pad*, pass it along the pew, and then return it to the starting point, noting the names of those sitting near you.

The flowers are given by *Kathy Parkins* to the glory of God and in honor of *Peter Fish*, whose indefatigable dedication to the archives of First Presbyterian Church will be remembered for years to come. The archives are found on the second floor of the education building and contain newspaper articles, church bulletins since 1920, and many photos and documents of historical significance. We are grateful to Peter for his dedication to this important project.

Inspired by today's Isaiah text, artist *Mason Armstrong* chose to focus on the general inclusivity within the community described. The image is of a big feast in the mountains, showing people without a care and enjoying their life and each other.

Childcare: A staffed nursery and children's playroom are available on the second floor of the education building during worship. **Activity bags** and baskets are available in the foyer for children. Please return them to the foyer at the end of worship.

Restroom locations: To the left and right as you exit the rear of the sanctuary; on the first and second floors of the education building; and on the first and second floors of the church house. There is an infant changing table in the restroom area located to the left as you exit the rear of the sanctuary.

Our *Paschal Candle and stained Red Oak Stand*, crafted by Marklin Candle Design of Contoocook, New Hampshire and given in memory of *Elder Ed Kwon*, was originally dedicated on April 30, 2017. This candle stands as a visible sign of God's enduring presence in our beautiful century-old sanctuary. Rooted in Passover (Pesach) and adopted by early Christians, the lit Candle represents the Risen Christ's triumph over darkness and death, his resurrection, to become the Light of the World.

The paraments and communion tablecloth used in worship today were given by Ruth and Russell Roberson in memory of their mothers: Zenobia Teresa Cox Haislip and Myrtle Taylor Roberson, both of whom were quilters, for the 150th Anniversary of the founding of First Presbyterian Church of Durham, North Carolina December 31,1871 - December 31, 2021. They were designed and sewn by Beth Taylor, a fabric artist and modern quilter. She created the unique communion cloth and paraments for First Presbyterian by including personal items of meaning and significance donated by members. Beth and her husband Robert Parker are former members of First Presbyterian Church and now live in the mountains of Virginia.

*The Lord's Prayer when Holy Communion is celebrated: From the beginning, one of the hallmarks of Reformed worship has been liturgy in the vernacular—in the common language of the people of God. Many, however, continue to use the language of another era (the Tudor dynasty) when praying the prayer Jesus taught. We hope that, by using this ecumenical version, new generations will learn and understand this prayer in a fresh way. Of course, you may always choose to pray in the words closest to your heart, be those words debts or trespasses.




